Guidelines and Requirements:

1. Select ONE country that is part of your heritage. If you are unsure about your heritage, you may pick any country for this project. (Not the United States)
2. Find 10 historical facts about your country
3. Find 10 geographical facts about your country.
4. Select 2 of the following topics. Find 10 facts for each of the two topics you choose.

Tourist attractions

People or person (political, athlete, musician, economist, friend, relative, artist)

Music

Traditions

Economic Facts

Products

Literature

Art

Games

(You may not choose food as a topic)

5. The last thing you will need to research is the impact the people from your country had on the United States. This could include immigrants from your country and their descendants that live in the United States. You should write a paragraph to be included on your project.
6. You must have at least 3 sources. Your sources may be from the internet, but you must have at least one book for a source. (Tip: an encyclopedia is a great source for this project!).
7. When gathering your information from the internet, you may not cut and paste. You must take notes, **on paper**, from the internet or an encyclopedia.
