- * The Greek city-states, however, united together to defend themselves against the Persian Empire
- * This was during the Persian War




PERSIAN WAR

* Athens and Sparta teamed up together with the other city-states to defend Greece and defeat the Persians



* After the Persian War, Athens and other city-states started the Delian league to protect each other.


* Athens developed an extremely powerful navy




CHANGES IN ATHENS

- ✤ Walls were built around the entire city
- Huge Marble buildings and temples were constructed
- Golden and Ivory Statues were made

* The Parthenon (re-created in Nashville Tennessee)



PERICLES

-An Athenian leader named Pericles gained great popularity with the people
-Good Public speaker
-He believed that the poor should take part in government, just like the rich
-He paid all government workers

PERICLES

-Pericles set up a jury system, much like our own in the U.S.A

-All jurors were paid for their duties

PELOPONNESIAN LEAGUE

- Sparta and other city-states formed the Peloponnesian League
- They were fearful and jealous of Athens's wealth and power
- Athens was still part of the Delian League





Peloponnesian League (Sparta) is Green

Delian League (Athens) is Orange




PELOPONNESIAN WAR

Athens Vs. Sparta

Sparta Attacked Athens to start the war Pericles ordered all Athenians to move behind the city's walls

> * The Spartans burned down all the farm land surrounding Athens

* Athenian Navy kept the food supply to Athens by controlling the sea port.



* Athens won most of the sea battles



Sparta won most of the land battles

Peloponnesian War, 431–404 B.C.




* As the war went on, disease began to spread throughout the crowded city of Athens

1/3 of the city of Athens died from the plague, including Pericles





* Eventually Sparta was able to cut off Athens's food supply by sea



* The starving Athenians were forced to surrender, ending the war

Sparta became the leading polis in Greece

* After the war, most city-states went back to fighting amongst each other

* This left all of Greece vulnerable to attack from Macedonia (Alexander the Great)
